Quorum. Opening Prayer. David Ware opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes. Prior to the meeting, Fern Riley presented electronically the minutes of the Vestry Meeting held on February 21, 2023, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Redeemer History Working Group. In response to the February 15, 2022 Vestry resolution to create a working group to research the relationship between Redeemer and the institution of slavery, the adoption of Jim Crow laws, and other practices in Maryland that disenfranchise communities, the Redeemer History Working Group was formed and has been researching the church's past. They had previously met with Vestry members on March 5 to discuss their research from the era of slavery. They continued their presentation of church history from the Jim Crow period. The Vestry and Working Group members discussed their findings. The group will continue their research through the summer and will present and discuss their work at the Vestry/Staff Retreat in October.
